DIVISION A. RACING - No Post Entries except to fill heats.

- All terriers including 4 up to 6-month puppies, must be muzzled.
- **NO Baskerville Muzzles Allowed.**
- Basket Muzzles preferred. Colored Basket and Colored Softies muzzles are NOT allowed. Black, Brown/Tan, Clear or White muzzles are acceptable. Collars should be off when on deck.
- All terriers entering the catch area during a race without a secured muzzle will be disqualified.
- No request for height measurement once racing has begun. Measurements by 7:45 AM
- Terriers May Not cross-enter between Adult, Veteran & Senior classes.
- **To be eligible to run in the Championship race**, a terrier Must Enter and Finish at least one flat race and one hurdle race. A **FINISHED race** is when the terrier runs down the track unassisted (by owner or anyone else) with a secured muzzle to the backside of the barrier. Terrier must place first in a flat or hurdle final to qualify for Champion runoffs. In the event a terrier does not meet all the above criteria, the second-place terrier in the final race of the class (either flats or hurdles) will qualify for the championship run off if they meet the criteria as outlined above.

Class 41: 10-12½” Veteran Championship. Open to 1st place winners of classes 14, 16, 35, 37. No entry fee.

Class 42: Over 12½-15” Veteran Championship. Open to 1st place winners of classes 15, 17, 36, 38. No



DIVISION B: CONFORMATION

Section I: YOUTH

- Child Handlers 5-9 years of age. They must handle a six month or older Jack Russell terrier.
- Youth Handlers: 10-16 years of age. The youth handler must handle the same adult terrier in all Youth Division classes entered. No puppies please. See rules for exceptions regarding injured terrier.
- Child/Youth exhibitor's age is determined as of January 1st of the current calendar year; except for those children turning 5 years of age. They may start competing in Child Handler any time of the year following their 5th birthday.
- Child/Youth entries must be JRTCA members either under a family membership or under an individual Youth membership.
- Entry fee is \$12.00 a class. Please list class number, child/youth's name, birthday, and dog's name on entry form.
- Quality of the dog is NOT to be considered.
- **Points are 1st=8 pts., 2nd=6 pts., 3rd=5 pts., 4th= 4 pts., 5th=3 pts., 6th= 2 pts., & Participation=1 pt.**

Class 43: Child Handler. Open to any youth aged 5 through 9 handling a JRT, six months of age or older. Judged on child's knowledge of the JR and ability to present his/her dog. Quality of the dog NOT to be considered.

Class 44: Youth Handler. Open to any youth aged 10–16 handling an adult Jack Russell Terrier. Judged on youth's knowledge of the JRT and ability to present his/her dog. Quality of dog NOT to be considered.

Class 45: Youth GTG. Open to any youth aged 10-16, handling an adult Jack Russell Terrier. Judged on youth's ability to present his or her dog and knowledge of GTG. To be run through the 10-ft. novice liner; time not to be considered.

Class 46: Youth High Score and Reserve will be awarded to the Youth Handlers with the most points in Classes 44 thru 45.

CONFORMATION

- Cross entering is not permitted within or between the Open and Working Sections.
- Exhibitors participating in the working Classes must submit the appropriate JRTCA Paperwork with entries. The judge may require a copy of The National Hunting Certificate to be presented to the ring steward at the time of judging.
- Registered terriers may submit a copy of the NHC Application, signed by a JRTCA Working Judge, within 30 days of the date it was issued.
Spayed or neutered terriers may only compete in Miscellaneous Conformation classes.

SECTION II. 3-up to 12 MONTH PUPS

Class 47: Pups, 3 up to 4 months (non-sanctioned)

4 up to 6 Mo. PUPS

Class 48: Dog pups, 4 up to 6 months

Class 49: Bitch pups, 4 up to 6 months

Class 50: BEST 4-6 MONTH PUPPY & RESERVE. Open to Best & Reserve of classes 48 & 49.

Section II. 6-12 Month PUPS

Class 51: Dog pups, 6 up to 9 months

Class 52: Dog pups, 9 up to 12 months

Class 53: **BEST DOG PUP & RESERVE**. Open to 1st and 2nd place winners of classes 51 & 52.

Class 54: Bitch pups, 6 up to 9 months

Class 55: Bitch pups, 9 up to 12 months

Class 56: **BEST BITCH PUP & RESERVE**. Open to 1st & 2nd place winners of classes 54 & 55.

Class 57: **PUPPY CONFORMATION CHAMPION & RESERVE**. Open to Best Puppy Dog & Reserve and Best Puppy Bitch & Reserve, class 53 & 56.

SECTION III. FAMILY

Class 58: Stud Dog & Get. Open to sire with at least 2, but not more than 3, offspring at side. Judged on Breed Standard and consistency of type.

Class 59: Brood Bitch & Produce. Open to dam with at least 2, but not more than 3, offspring at side. Judged on Breed Standard and consistency of type.

Class 60: **BEST FAMILY**. Open to first & second place winners of classes 58 & 59. No entry fees

Class 61: **3 Generation Class** - A minimum of three successive generations of breeding; the second and successive generations must be bred by the exhibitor.

SECTION IV. MISCELLANIOUS

Open to any adult JRT including those spayed and neutered. Judged on breed standard unless otherwise noted.

Class 62: Veteran Dog. Open to any Jack Russell Terrier dog six years or older. Judged on Breed Standard and condition of dog.

Class 63: Veteran Bitch. Open to any Jack Russell Terrier Bitch six years or older. Judged on Breed Standard and condition of dog.

Class 64: **BEST VETERAN**. Open to 1st & 2nd place winners of classes 62 & 63

Class 65: Spayed/Neutered Adult. Open to any spayed/neutered adult.

Class 66: Spayed/Neutered Working Terrier

Conformation cont.

Class 67: Companion. Open to all JRTS. Judged on companionship, cuteness, personality, obedience, and tricks. Not to be judged on breed standard, non-sanctioned.

Juniors Terriers aged 12-24 months. Terriers can cross enter into open adult conformation or working.

Class 68: Junior Dog (non-sanctioned)

Class 69: Junior Bitches (non-sanctioned)

Class 70: BEST JUNIOR TERRIER & RESERVE Open to 1st and 2nd place winners in classes 68 and 69

Class 71: Colored Terriers

Suitability.

Judge's Choice. The dog the judge would choose to take hunting to each of the quarry listed below.

Class 72: Suitability to Red Fox

Class 73: Suitability to Groundhog

Class 74: Suitability to Raccoon/Badger.

Class 75: BEST SUITABILITY & RESERVE. Judges' choice for the most suitable all-around working terrier. Open to 1st & 2nd place winners of Classes 72,73,74. (non-sanctioned)

SECTION V. JRTCA WORKING TERRIERS.

Open to any JRTCA registered terrier owned by a JRTCA member which holds a JRTCA NHC. Terriers entering this section may not cross- enter in Open; no cross-entering is permitted within the Working section.

Class 76: Bred by Exhibitor Working Terrier Dog, 1 year & over.

Class 77: Bronze Medallion Dog. Open to any dog which has earned the JRTCA Bronze Medallion for Special Merit in the Field.

Class 78: Working Terrier Dog, 1 year & over, 10 up to 12½."

Class 79: Working Terrier Dog, 1 year & over, over 12½" up to 15."

Class 80: Veteran Working Terrier Dog, 6 years and over.

Class 81: BEST JRTCA WORKING TERRIER DOG & RESERVE. Open to first & second place winners of classes 76 through 80; no entry fee

Class 82: Bred by Exhibitor Working Terrier Bitch, 1 year & over.

Class 83: Bronze Medallion Bitch. Open to any Bitch which has earned the JRTCA Bronze Medallion for Special Merit in the Field.

Class 84: Working Terrier Bitch, 1 year & over, 10 up to 12½."

Class 85: Working Terrier Bitch, 1 year & over, over 12½" up to 15."

Class 86: Veteran Working Terrier Bitch, 6 years and over.

Class 87: BEST JRTCA WORKING TERRIER BITCH & RESERVE. Open to first & second place winners of classes 82 through 86; no entry fee.

Class 88: JRTCA WORKING TERRIER CONFORMATION CHAMPION & RESERVE. Open to first & second place winners of classes 81 & 87. No entry fees.

SECTION VI. OPEN ADULT.

No cross-entering is permitted within the Open Section. Cross-entering is not permitted between the Open Section and the Working Section

Class 89: Bred by Exhibitor Dog. Open to any adult JR owned and bred by the exhibitor; must be handled by the breeder under whose kennel prefix the terrier is registered or a member of the breeder's immediate family.

Class 90: Dogs, 1 year & over, 10 up to 12½", smooth

Class 91: Dogs, 1 year & over, 10 up to 12½", rough/broken.

Class 92: Dogs, 1 year & over, over 12½" up to 15", smooth

Class 93: Dogs, 1 year & over, over 12½" up to 15", rough/broken.

Class 94: BEST OPEN DOG & RESERVE. Open to first & second place winners of classes 89-93. No entry

Class 95: Bred by Exhibitor Bitch. Open to any adult JR owned and bred by the exhibitor; must be handled by the breeder under whose kennel prefix the terrier is registered or a member of the breeder's immediate family.

Class 96: Bitches, 1 year & over, 10 up to 12½", smooth

Class 97: Bitches, 1 year & over, 10 up to 12½", rough/broken.

Class 98: Bitches, 1 year & over, over 12½" up to 15", smooth

Class 99: Bitches, 1 year & over, over 12½" up to 15", rough/broken.

Class 100: BEST OPEN BITCH & RESERVE. Open to first & second place winners of classes 95-99. No fee

Class 101: BEST OPEN TERRIER & RESERVE. Open to first & second place winners of classes 94 & 100.

No entry fees

DIVISION C—GO-TO-GROUND

- Schooling prior to the competition is not permitted. Any violation of this rule shall result in disqualification from the Go-To-Ground competition at this trial. See posted rules at event.

***FOR ALL CLASSES;** work is defined as baying, digging, concentrated stare, whining or biting at the bars. A break in work is defined as ceasing to work for a period of more than ten seconds. Leaving the quarry is defined as moving back in the tunnel away from quarry and out of the view of the judge. The judge may halt the work if the judge believes the terrier is injuring itself. Terrier is not to leave quarry once it is reached, for all classes.

- Must work quarry continuously for one full minute, without a break in work, unless noted.
- No Adult terrier may compete in the Championship Certificate class until the Trial Certificate has been applied for and issued and received.
- Please be courteous; Let someone run between your dog's when you have more than one.
- Copies of JRTCA GTG trial certificate must be submitted with pre-entries or presented to the den steward at the time of judging in all championship classes.
- Open Puppy & Open Adult, Puppy & Adult Championship classes-1 second per total feet of tunnel to reach quarry.
- **Cross-entering is not permitted between open or certificate classes.**

GTG continued

Class 102: Pre-Novice Puppy. Open to pups 4 up to 6 mos. Entry in this class does not affect pup's eligibility to enter Novice class after 6 mos. of age. One min. to reach quarry; mark for 15 seconds without a break in work and without leaving quarry; may leave earth and re-enter until quarry is reached.

Class 103: Novice Puppy. Open to JRTs 6 up to 12 months which have not scored 100% in this class at a previous JRTCA trial. Entries earning a score of 100% at this trial may, upon payment of the entry fee, enter the Open Puppy class at this trial. One minute to reach quarry; may leave earth and re-enter several times until quarry is reached; must work quarry for continuously for a full 30 seconds without a break in work and without leaving the quarry; may switch from one type of work to another.

Class 104: Open Puppy. Open to JRT's 6 up to 12 months which have scored 100% in a Novice Go-To-Ground class at this or a previous JRTCA trial. Puppies 6-12 months who have earned 100% in the open Puppy class at this trial may, upon payment of the entry fee enter the Puppy Championship class at this trial OR may continue competing in Open Puppy GTG class at future trials. Winners of the puppy GTG Championship class will determine the Puppy GTG Champion and Reserve. **OPEN PUPPY GTG IS NOT OPEN TO ANY PUPPY WHICH HAS COMPETED IN PUPPY CHAMPIONSIP GTG**

1 second per total feet of tunnel to reach quarry; may leave earth once and re-enter before quarry is reached; must work quarry continuously for one full minute without a break in work and without leaving quarry; may switch from one type of work to another.

Class: 105: Puppy GTG Championship. Open to JRT pups 6 up to 12 months, which have scored 100% on Open Puppy G-T-G at this or a previous JRTCA trial. A copy of the 100% score sheet must be submitted with a pre-entry or shown to den steward at the time of the class. Puppies may move up to this class on the same day as qualifying in Open G-T-G, upon payment of additional fee. 1st. and 2nd. Place winners will be Puppy G-T-G Champion and Reserve. 1 second per total feet of tunnel to reach quarry; may leave earth once and re-enter before quarry is reached; when quarry is reached, must work quarry continuously for one full minute without a break in work and without leaving quarry; may switch from one type of work to another.

Class 106: Novice Adult. Open to JRTs one year or older which have not scored 100% in this class at a previous JRTCA trial. Entries earning a score of 100% at this trial may, upon payment of entry fee, enter the Open Adult class at this trial. One minute to reach quarry; may leave earth and re-enter several times until quarry is reached; must work quarry continuously for a full 30 seconds without a break in work and without leaving the quarry; may switch from one type of work to another.

Class 107: Open Adult. Open to adult JRTs which have scored 100% in a Novice Go-To-Ground class at this or a previous JRTCA trial. 1 second per total feet of tunnel to reach quarry; may leave earth once and re-enter before quarry is reached; work quarry continuously for one full minute without a break in work and without leaving quarry; may switch from one type of work to another. May not move up to championship classes until certificate is in hand.

Class 159: Beyond Geriatrics age 12 and up.

GTG: Continued

GO-TO-GROUND CERTIFICATE CLASSES – NO CROSS ENTERING Open to any adult Jack Russell 10 up to 15” who holds a JRTCA Trial Certificate. Copy of certificate must be submitted with pre-entry or shown to Den Steward at time of class. 1 second per total feet of tunnel to reach quarry; may not leave earth; work quarry for one full minute without a break in work and without leaving quarry. **First and second place winners will be GTG Champion & Reserve.**

Class 108: 10 up to 12½” Adult Championship Certificate

Class 109: Over 12½ up to 15” Adult Championship Certificate

Class 110: 10 up to 12½” Veteran Championship Certificate

Class 111: Over 12½ up to 15” Veteran Championship Certificate

Class 112: 10 up to 12½” Senior Championship Certificate.

Class 113: Over 12½ up to 15” Senior Championship Certificate.

DIVISION D — SUPER EARTH.

Challenging GTG course; open to any JRT 6 mos. or older.

All Super Earth classes-1 second per total feet of tunnel to reach quarry; may leave earth and re-enter several times until the quarry is reached; then must work quarry for one minute a break in work and without leaving quarry. May switch from one type of work to another without penalty. Copy of JRTCA trial certificate must be submitted with pre-entries or presented to the den steward at the time of judging.

Class 115: Open Adult Super Earth. Open to terriers one year and older.

Class 116: Open Veteran Super Earth. Open to terriers six years and older.

Class 117: 6 up to 12-month Puppy Champion Super Earth. Open to 6 up to 12 months JRT puppies which have earned 100% in an Open 6 up to 12 months Puppy Super Earth Class at this or a previous JRTCA Trial. ~Handler must remain at the starting area. ~No directional hand signals allowed. ~Verbal commands to praise or recall is allowed. ~No schooling is permitted in area prior to competition starting. The terrier is judged on its ability to follow a line in a simulated natural hunting environment, to locate and mark the quarry. The terrier is judged on a combination of time and accuracy. The terrier with the fastest time is not necessarily the winner. The starting point is a natural marked spot indicated by the judge. The end is a natural marked spot approx. 2-3 ft. from the actual quarry. ~See posted rules for additional information.

How fast can your terrier find a rat or other quarry in the brush? Your dog will be timed from release in a natural but fenced-in area where there will quarry protected by a cage yet hidden in the area. The judge will call time once the quarry is located, and the dog starts working the quarry. Ribbons awarded 1st – 6th.

DIVISION H. THUNDER TUNNEL (Non-Sanctioned)

A timed event/competition with the terrier working its way through a tunnel maze that may have dead ends and obstacles to maneuver. The tunnel has a clear side so you can see the progress of your terrier as it makes its way to the caged quarry. The terrier runs the tunnel twice; the best time is the final time that counts towards placement.

The Jack Russell Terrier Homestead Project Update

Many thanks to all who donated the Homestead Project! We have approximately \$34,466.64. This is a long way from our goal, but it is a good start! Many fundraising projects will be happening this year – we will keep you posted on the progress!

What is the Homestead Project?

The Homestead Project is a joint venture between the JRTCA and the JRT Museum & Crawford Library. The goal is to purchase a property that will be suitable to house both the JRTCA offices and the Museum, and to hold trials, educational training, practice days, fieldwork, and more.

Ideally it would be large enough to hold the JRTCA National Trial. Keeping the Museum together with the JRTCA is important as their work and purposes overlap and are essential to the protection and preservation of the TRUE Jack Russell Terrier. It will be a tribute to Ailsa Crawford, the JRTCA's founder.

Why is it needed?

It is necessary to ensure the future of both the JRTCA and the Museum by providing a permanent home with fixed costs that will allow it to generate income to pay for itself.

For many years now the JRTCA has been renting costly office space and has faced several large moves over the past 15 years. Each of these moves resulted in expensive moving costs as well as increased rental costs. With the addition of The Museum rental requirements have doubled both in size and cost; the Museum has already faced one move and has already outgrown our current space.

There has been much uncertainty and confusion during the past decade since the variants of the Jack Russell Terrier were introduced by the AKC. Education is more important than ever and reaching the people to educate is more difficult. The JRTCA is smaller, and although it is now a very dedicated group of members interested in the breed for the right reasons, it is also a large financial burden for the membership to bear.

The Club and Museum cannot continue to ask members for more donations and increased fees as operating costs continue to rise. A permanent home that could generate income to pay for itself would solve that problem – and stop the waste of membership money going down the tubes to pay large rent each month.

The Museum operates strictly on donations and fundraisers – there are no members. To date just enough money is being raised to cover operating costs, and not enough to pursue educational planning efforts of the Museum.

There are many plans in the works for educational projects through both the Museum and the JRTCA to promote and preserve the TRUE Jack Russell Terrier. A permanent location will allow this to happen and ensure our future. Part of those plans include the ability to take this education on the road to visit extensively throughout the country.

The Homestead will provide many benefits to members and Jack Russell lovers throughout the country – it will be a training facility, a practice facility, home of sanctioned trials, an educational Museum and Library, perhaps a Rescue foster area, a place to store our equipment, a central office, and most importantly a place for Jack Russell enthusiasts to gather enjoy and learn from everything Jack Russell!

What do we need to do?

First and foremost, we need to raise funds to have a substantial down payment on a property. Both the Museum and the JRTCA have implemented separate bank accounts for just this purpose. We need to have a substantial down payment before we can seriously look for the property. The more we have to put down, the lower the monthly payments will be and the better a property we can find.

What can members and friends of the true JRT do?

Members, and anyone who cares about this terrier, can of course offer donations – There are close to 2,000 members in the JRTCA – if every member donated \$25 (includes every adult member in a family membership) we could immediately raise close to \$50,000. Smaller amounts of \$5-20 would also help significantly, and of course if you can do more than \$25 that would be wonderful – no donation is too large or too small. This will give us a great start towards our goal.

We do not expect to raise all the money needed through member donations – JRTCA members and any true Jack Russell enthusiasts can help by doing fundraisers, no matter how large or small, in your area – every bit helps no matter how large or small.

Here in this area, we are considering a monthly Bingo at our local American Legion. We are looking at fun days, raffles, 50/50's, possible events such as crab feasts or bull roasts – all to benefit the Homestead Project. They do not need to be Jack Russell related. You can do fundraising at any level in your local areas.

The Museum is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit – donations are tax deductible. The JRTCA is an educational non-profit, and therefore not tax deductible.

To donate to the Museum, checks can be made out to the JRT Museum, PayPal payments can be sent to PayPal@jackrussellterriermuseum.com, or you can call the office with a credit card.

Check out Amazon Smile – you can find the JRT Museum there. Many of us shop Amazon, and a portion of your purchase could be donated through their non-profit program.

All funds marked HOMESTEAD go into a separate account for this purpose and we will keep everyone posted of our progress during the coming year!

Talk to other people who are not members – many may be willing to donate to this project. Once a property is obtained, it will be open to all at times for education and training!

The JRTCA and the Museum are working on many plans to ensure our futures – but we can't do it alone.

This is a VERY IMPORTANT project. Ailsa Crawford wanted so much to see this happen and wanted to help us financially. Unfortunately, she passed away before she could help or see it happen. This will be her legacy, our legacy, and the JRTCA's future.

Let's make it happen!

GENERAL RULES FOR EXHIBITORS RULES FOR EACH EVENT WILL BE POSTED AT THAT EVENT

1. ALL SANCTIONED CLASSES ARE OPEN TO JACK RUSSELL TERRIERS ONLY.
2. EXHIBITORS AND OWNERS OF TERRIERS ENTERED MUST BE CURRENT JRTCA MEMBERS AND NOT BE A MEMBER OF A CONFLICTING JRT ORGANIZATION OR REGISTER THEIR JRTS IN ANY ALL-BREED REGISTRY. IF AN EXHIBITOR IS FOUND TO BE IN VIOLATION OF THIS POLICY, ENTRY WILL BE DISQUALIFIED AND NO REFUNDS WILL BE GIVEN. IF A VIOLATION IS CONFIRMED AFTER THE TRIAL, PLACEMENTS WILL BE VOIDED FROM ALL JRTCA RECORDS. EXHIBITORS MUST SUBMIT A COMPLETED ENTRY FORM INCLUDING A SIGNED WAIVER FOR EVERY TRIAL THEY ENTER.
3. ENTRIES MUST BE WITHIN THE 10 - 15" JRTCA HEIGHT STANDARD (WITH THE EXCEPTION OF PUPS WHO HAVE NOT YET MET THE 10" HEIGHT STANDARD); MEASURING DEVICES WILL BE AVAILABLE ON THE TRIAL GROUNDS.
4. PUPPIES (UNDER 12 MONTHS) ARE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR A CHAMPIONSHIP IN ANY DIVISION BUT THEIR OWN. PUPPIES ARE ELIGIBLE TO COMPETE ONLY IF THEY HAVE REACHED THEIR FOUR-MONTH BIRTHDAY (NOT 16 WEEKS). A PUPPY'S AGE IS THE ACTUAL AGE THE PUP IS ON THE DAY OF THE TRIAL.
5. BITCHES IN SEASON MAY NOT COMPETE IN ANY DIVISION. PRE-ENTRY FEES OF BITCHES IN SEASON WILL BE REFUNDED WITH A VETERINARIAN CERTIFICATE, OR AS OTHERWISE AGREED UPON BY THE TRIAL CHAIRPERSON.
6. SPAYED OR NEUTERED TERRIERS MAY COMPETE IN MISCELLANEOUS CONFORMATION. THEY MAY NOT COMPETE IN PUPPY, FAMILY, OPEN OR WORKING CONFORMATION. *NOTE: FOR FAMILY CLASSES; BROOD BITCHES & STUD DOGS ENTERED MAY NOT BE SPAYED/NEUTERED. THE OFFSPRING AT THEIR SIDES MAY BE INTACT OR SPAYED/NEUTERED.
7. A TERRIER BRED BY A SANCTIONED JRTCA JUDGE MAY NOT BE SHOWN UNDER THAT JUDGE IN THE CONFORMATION DIVISION.
8. TERRIERS OWNED OR CO-OWNED BY THE TRIAL CHAIRPERSON, OR ANY MEMBER OF THEIR HOUSEHOLD, MAY NOT BE ENTERED IN ANY PHASE OF THE COMPETITION, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF CHILD AND YOUTH HANDLING CLASSES.
9. TERRIERS OWNED BY JUDGES MAY NOT BE ENTERED IN THE DIVISION IN WHICH THEY ARE JUDGING; BUT MAY ENTER THE COMPETITION IN ANY OTHER DIVISION.
10. TERRIERS OWNED BY STEWARDS MAY BE ENTERED IN ANY DIVISION PROVIDED THAT THEY FIND A SUBSTITUTE TO PERFORM THEIR DUTIES OR HAVE SOMEONE ELSE SHOW THEIR TERRIERS.
11. REQUESTS FOR THE MEASUREMENT OF A TERRIER ENTERED IN ANY CLASS NUMBER MAY BE MADE ONLY BY ANOTHER EXHIBITOR IN THAT SAME CLASS NUMBER OR BY THE JUDGE EXCEPT IN RACING. REQUESTS FOR THE MEASUREMENT OF A TERRIER IN RACING MAY BE MADE BY THE JUDGE OR BY AN EXHIBITOR WITH A TERRIER ENTERED IN THE SAME CLASS NUMBER OR, IF CLASSES ARE SPLIT BY GENDER, MAY CALL FOR THE MEASUREMENT OF A TERRIER IN THE SAME AGE AND HEIGHT CATEGORY. (EXAMPLE: THE OWNER OF AN UNDER-ADULT DOG ENTERED IN RACING MAY CALL FOR THE MEASUREMENT OF AN UNDER-ADULT BITCH AS THE POTENTIAL EXISTS FOR THEM TO RACE EACH OTHER IN THE CHAMPIONSHIP RACES.) EXHIBITORS RACING PUPPIES' MAY CALL FOR MEASUREMENT OF A PUPPY IN A DIFFERENT AGE CATEGORY AS LONG AS IT IS IN THE SAME HEIGHT CATEGORY. THE PERSON MAKING THE REQUEST FOR MEASUREMENT MUST NAME THE TERRIER OR TERRIERS THEY WISH TO HAVE MEASURED, BUT REQUESTS FOR MEASUREMENT OF ENTIRE CLASSES WILL NOT BE HONORED. THE MEASUREMENT OF THE TERRIER WILL BE CONSIDERED THE TERRIER'S OFFICIAL HEIGHT FOR THE DURATION OF THE TRIAL. ONLY JRTCA HEIGHT CARDS ISSUED AFTER SEPTEMBER 1999 WILL BE HONORED.
12. EXCESSIVE USE OF SQUEAKY OR FUR-LIKE BAITING DEVICES BY EXHIBITORS IS PROHIBITED AND MAY RESULT IN THE EXHIBITOR BEING EXCUSED FROM THE CLASS. "EXCESSIVE USE" WILL BE AT THE JUDGE'S DISCRETION.
13. EXHIBITORS PARTICIPATING IN THE JRTCA WORKING TERRIER CLASSES OR CERTIFICATE GO-TO-GROUND & SUPER EARTH MUST SUBMIT THE APPROPRIATE JRTCA CERTIFICATES WITH PRE-ENTRIES OR AT THE TIME OF POST-ENTRY. THE JUDGE MAY REQUIRE A COPY OF THE CERTIFICATE BE PRESENTED TO THE RING/DEN STEWARD AT TIME OF JUDGING. REGISTERED TERRIERS MAY SUBMIT A COPY OF NHC APPLICATION SIGNED BY A JRTCA WORKING JUDGE WITHIN 30 DAYS OF THE DATE IT WAS ISSUED.
14. PUPPIES UNDER THE AGE OF THREE MONTHS ARE NOT PERMITTED ON THE TRIAL GROUNDS. ANY PERSON VIOLATING THIS RULE WILL BE EXCUSED FROM ALL CLASSES ENTERED AND ASKED TO LEAVE THE TRIAL SITE. THIS APPLIES TO RV'S AND CAMPERS IF AT THE SAME ADDRESS AS TRIAL GROUNDS
15. ALL DOGS MUST BE LEASHED OR CRATED EXCEPT WHEN COMPETITION REQUIRES OFF-LEASH WORK. NO LIBERTY LEASHES ALLOWED.
16. OVERLY AGGRESSIVE DOGS, OR AN OWNER'S FAILURE TO CONTROL THEIR DOG, MAY RESULT IN DISQUALIFICATION AT THE DISCRETION OF THE JUDGES OR THE TRIAL CHAIRPERSON.
17. THE ABUSE OF DOGS OR SEVERE DISCIPLINING OF DOGS ON THE TRIAL GROUNDS IS PROHIBITED.
18. DOGS OTHER THAN JRTS ON THE GROUNDS MAY BE EXCLUDED OR PERMITTED AT THE DISCRETION OF THE TRIAL CHAIRPERSON. IF OTHER BREEDS ARE ALLOWED, THEY MUST BE LEASHED OR CONTAINED AT ALL TIMES.
19. EXHIBITORS ARE RESPONSIBLE TO DOUBLE CHECK THE CLASSES THEY HAVE ENTERED AND BE ON TIME. NO REFUNDS WILL BE GIVEN FOR MISSED CLASSES.
20. THE OWNER/HANDLER OF A TERRIER ENTERING ANY CLASS DOES SO AT HIS/HER OWN RISK AND AGREES TO ABIDE BY THE RULES OF THE JRTCA AND THE TRIAL.

21. UNSPORTSMANLIKE CONDUCT WILL NOT BE TOLERATED. ANYONE DEMONSTRATING SUCH BEHAVIOR WILL BE ASKED TO LEAVE THE TRIAL SITE AND NO ENTRY FEES WILL BE REFUNDED.
22. ALL DOGS BROUGHT TO JRTCA SANCTIONED TRIALS MUST BE CURRENT ON VACCINATIONS. NO DOGS OF ANY AGE MAY BE BROUGHT TO A TRIAL WHO HAVE SUSPICION OF CONTAGIOUS OR INFECTIOUS DISEASE.
23. JUDGES MUST NOT EAT, SMOKE, OR USE CELL PHONES WHILE AT THEIR EVENTS.
24. **THE JUDGE'S DECISION CONCERNING PLACEMENTS ARE FINAL IN ALL DIVISIONS.**
